Do Nothing

- No additional sewage collection and treatment capacity would be built to accommodate the prescribed growth
- Serves as a benchmark to assess the other alternatives

Is there a compromise between do nothing and still recognizing the need and requirement for growth?

Discharge to Lake Ontario

- Connection to the York Durham Sewage System via some combination of tunnel, pumping station(s) and forcemain(s)

Discharge to Lake Simcoe

- Requires an advanced wastewater treatment plant guided by the Lake Simcoe Protection Plan (including the *draft* Phosphorus Reduction Strategy and the possibility of Water Quality Trading)

What kind of treatment technologies? What about Phosphorus? Can you build another wastewater treatment plant on Lake Simcoe?

Innovative Wastewater Treatment Technologies

- Innovative wastewater treatment technologies will be considered in the Upper York Sewage Solutions Environmental Assessment. At a minimum this will include, but not be limited to, consideration of the development and use of a wastewater purification system and water recycling facilities to be located in The Regional Municipality of York (extracted from the Minister of the Environment’s approval of the Terms of Reference)

What is a Water Reclamation Centre and what does it look like? Who would get the ‘reused’ water?
